IEEE STCBP Conference for Research on Equity and Sustained Participation in Engineering, Computing, & Technology

Understanding how to apply fundamental computer science problem solving skills is quickly becoming a required competency. It is critical to address issues of equity and inclusion so that we can engage all people in learning key concepts in computing. The conference for **Research on Equity and Sustained Participation in Engineering, Computing, and Technology (RESPECT)** was established in 2015 to address these needs, serving to build a strong community, theory, and foundation for research on broadening participation. Since then, RESPECT has emerged as an important scholarly venue that brings together researchers in gender studies, sociology, education, learning sciences, computer science, and related fields to disseminate and promote interdisciplinary work on broadening participation in computing and engineering. RESPECT conference proceedings of peer-reviewed articles are submitted for inclusion in the IEEE Xplore. Extended versions of RESPECT papers have resulted in three special issues of the IEEE Computing in Science and Engineering journal.

Over 100 researchers representing more than 80 distinct organizations from 4 continents and over 30 US states attended RESPECT'19, which took place on February 27, 2019 in Minneapolis, Minnesota and was co-located with SIGCSE'19. The themes of equity and inclusion were, by design, pervasive throughout the RESPECT program. The conference program included research and experience papers that examined social, cultural, and economic factors related to the underrepresentation of women and people of color in computing disciplines; explore how intersectional identities impact experiences of computing; and propose interventions to mitigate implicit bias and promote inclusive pedagogy in computer science classrooms, including through K-12 teacher preparation. In addition, the 2019 RESPECT program jointly organized with [Researcher-Practitioner Partnerships for CS](#) (RPP for CS).

To celebrate our fifth-year anniversary, our RESPECT 2020 theme is **“Learning from the past. Building for the future.”** The conference will be co-located with SIGCSE 2020 on March 11, 2020 in Portland, Oregon. For more information, visit <http://respect2020.stcbp.org/>.
